

As we were walking on the beach looking for pretty shells, I started noticing our footprints. This got me wondering, who will ever see them? Will they wash away before the next person walks by? Will the next person wonder who left them? This intrusive thought led me to this month's topic.



Will you leave your footprints in wet sand or wet cement?*

Within the secure walls of Olive Branch Lodge, the teachings and symbolism of Masonry are passed down to new generations of Masons. The importance of building, not just structures, but strong character and a better society, is a focal point of our discussions. Staying in Touch with the Lodge




